SIMPLE PRESENT AND PRESENT CONTINIOUS FOR FUTURE MEANING

- We can use 'The Present Continuous Tense' to talk about future plans or arrangements. A future arrangement is a plan that you have already decided and organised. These arrangements are very common with verbs of travelling, and when we are meeting people. We can also use a future time expression. e.g. tomorrow, next week, tomorrow at 5 p.m., etc.
 - I am meeting Lucas at 2 o'clock tomorrow afternoon.
 - I am flying to London tomorrow evening.
- We can use the Simple Present Tense to make statements about events that will occur at a time later than now, when the statements are based on present facts that are something fixed like a timetable, schedule, or calendar.
 - The bus arrives at 8.00 a.m. tomorrow.
 - There is a math exam next Monday at 9.00.




